Teaching Parents with Zeal - Make a Difference Day!

Make a Difference Day was held Saturday, October 27, 2007, at the Catholic Charities on the Southside of Chicago. The Stork’s

Nest is a service program that focuses on the health, education, and well-being of parents and their children.

The keynote speaker, Tasha Wilkerson, spoke to the young ladies about having a vision, thinking big and focusing on your strengths. “When you walk out of here, you have to have a vision for your yourself.” says Wilkerson. These inspiring words gave everyone an opportunity to reflect, refocus and renew their vision.

Charlotte Taylor, TPZ President, gave two presentations about Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) and Breast Cancer. SIDS is the #1 cause of death in babies between 1 month and 1 year of age. African American babies are 2 to 3 times more likely to die of SIDS than white babies. The Breast Cancer Awareness workshop was informative. Breast cancer affects 1 out of 10 African American women. Participants were taught how to properly examine their breast in order to increase the chances of early detection.

At the end of the presentations, Siobhan Sanders presented gift bags and baskets to the young ladies who attended the Stork’s Nest workshops throughout the year. Everyone who attended this wonderful “Make a Difference Day” left with lots of information, goodies, and full bellies! Great job to the event coordinators!

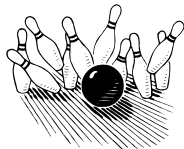
Friends of Pearls...Make a Strike!!
